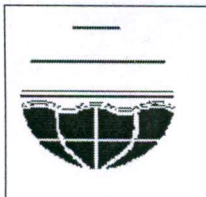



Shri. P.S. Pankaj, Incharge, WMC-I informed to the Chairman of the Committee that due to sudden re-scheduling of training programme on BMW at Chennai from 01.02.2016 to 03.02.2016 the meeting Notice could not be issued to members. However discussion on the issues relating to treatment / disposal of BMW was held and the following decisions were taken-

1. Bio-Medical Waste Cell will estimate / compile the quantity and nature of the BMW generated in Delhi from all Health Care Units. The quantity generated to be compared with the treatment facility available to examine the gaps in the treatment infrastructure.

The transportation of the bio-medical waste needs to be monitored randomly to make sure the waste does not land in unauthorized hands, raising the chances of infection. Whether existing policy stipulations with regard to transport are being complied with needs to be reported by the BMW Cell.

All the details of the treatment/disposal after the autoclaving by (CBWTF) may be ascertained.

The proposal to allow big hospitals to do autoclaving may be examined. After autoclaving how and where the autoclaved waste will be disposed off may also be examined. Adequate competition in treatment of BMW is essential for proper treatment. A monopoly may not be conducive for better service and compliance. An open competitive process can be adopted for providing service providers for treatment disposal of autoclaved wasted / biomedical waste. Eligibility criteria in this regard may be worked out.

The BMW Cell should prepare the action taken report on the above mentioned points and place it in the next meeting to be held within 15 days.

2. In the next meeting representative of Delhi Medical Association may also be invited to obtain their views to improve Ease of Doing Business and ensure compliance of the standards etc.
