**OFFICE ORDER**

1. In order to facilitate Ease of Doing Business, the procedure of granting consent / authorization / registration etc. has been reviewed and is modified as under.
2. The units / HCE / RESDH / industries shall have the following classifications :-
  - (I) which do not require installation of pollution control device(s) such as Emission Control System (ECS) or Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) / Sewage Treatment Plant (STP).
  - (II) which require installation of pollution control device(s) for controlling pollution in emission / effluent
    - (a) SPIs / STPs of DJB, WTPs of DJB, CETPs / Power Plants / MSW Plants etc.
    - (b) Other than those falling under clause (a).

The DPCC will separately notify the list of units / HCE / RESDH / industries, alongwith nature of the activities therein, for information of all concerned.

3. The Deciding Authority & Timeline, etc. for disposal of applications for consent / authorization / registration, etc. shall be as tabulated below:-

4. Consent to establish (or its renewal) in EIA cases shall be granted by the Cell In-charge / Sr. Environment Engineer concerned during the validity of Environmental Clearance. Trial to run the pollution control devices and collect and test the data shall also be allowed by the Cell In-charge / Sr. Environment Engineer concerned at the time of granting consent to establish. The trial will be permitted within the period of maximum three months from the date of completion. The project proponent shall, however, give prior intimation of the dates on which the trial would start and end. As regards the cases where consent to establish has already been granted, the Cell in-charge / Sr. Environment Engineer concerned shall initially issue the consent for conducting trial run within a period of three months from the date of completion of the project on the receipt of the information from the Project Proponent about completion of the project. The consent to trial shall not be consent to operate, however the project proponent shall apply for consent to operate along with the requisite details and test reports to the DPCC. The consent to operate in EIA cases will be decided by the Committee meant for category II (a) as mentioned in the table above.



5. Registration of traders for import of other waste under the HWM Rules, amended to date shall be granted as per extant rules and practice.
6. The Consent to Establish (CTE) shall be for a minimum period of one year or as requested by the unit / Project Proponent.
7. In future, cases of grant / renewal of consent shall be submitted to the Committee concerned in the format enclosed as Annexure-A duly signed by the Senior Environment Engineer and Environment Engineer, in charge of the area. The format briefly captures the information relevant for decision.
8. The present practice in DPCC of insisting submission of MCD (health) license / Delhi Police License is not mandated by law relating to environment – Air Act, 1981 / Water Act, 1974 / Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. In fact, envisaging such requirements may make applicant to shuttle between offices. For taking decision, one office demands clearance(s) from other office and vice versa. This is against the Ease of Doing Business. Submission of MCD (health) license / Delhi Police licenses shall therefore be not a precondition for processing grant of consent/renewal of consent. However, the applicant must produce a proof for conformity of land use. The conformity of land use can be proved by producing the fact of sanction of building plans or any official record/law relating to land use planning showing land use conformity.
9. Likewise, the present practice of insisting submission adequacy report has become just a redtape. The agencies just prepare it in a mechanical manner and charge a substantial amount for preparation of such reports. An important element in preparing adequacy report is to know the flow pattern and characteristics of effluents. The collection of hard data to this effect is generally missing. For DPCC, what is relevant is satisfactory treatment of effluent/emission so that prescribed norms are met. The best way to test the efficacy of a pollution control device is not by way of generating adequacy report but by taking proper samples and testing them. The present system of adequacy report is not serving the requisite purpose. In view of this adequacy reports will no longer be required. Instead, DPCC shall place in public domain model adequacy reports/design criteria of the design of pollution control devices for as many flow patterns for various types of units as possible. This can then used by applicants for properly designing their pollution control devices. The mandate of DPCC is to control pollution, which can be achieved only by lifting samples properly and testing them and then taking action against those violating the norms. The DPCC engineers conducting inspection will lift samples and get them tested from DPCC lab by coding it so that the lab personnel

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involved in testing do not know the identity of unit or unit owner. Third party audit also needs to be put in practice.

10. All the application(s) along with requisite documents / enclosures / fee etc. shall be processed through online system. The details of the application and the status and decision thereon shall be fully viewable to the public on the website. In case the application is submitted digitally signed, hardcopy need not be submitted.
11. No prior approval of MS/Chairman will be required to inspect F-27/33 units operating in non-confirming areas and negative/prohibited units operating in Delhi. The system of prior approval causes unnecessary delay in enforcing the law. However, inspection will be done processed through the online system, and status, inspection report and decision thereon shall be fully viewable to the public.
12. All existing orders and instructions on the subject shall stand modified as above.
